Premiere season coming in January: an opportunity to hear incredible virtuosity from a Grammy-winning Choir, and the finest orchestral musicians!

The new Arizona Bach Festival will take place January 3 – 7, 2010 at Valley locations. The orchestra features members of the Phoenix Symphony, the chorus is the Phoenix Chorale (of Grammy fame), the guest concertmaster is Dr. Stephen Redfield, the concert organists are Dr. Kimberly Marshall and Scott Dettra, and the conductor is Scott Youngs.

Bach to the Valley in the finest performances of internationally-renowned artists.
